Make an Octagon Table

Instructor: Bob Simmons



Prerequisite: This is an Intermediate hand-tool class, requiring skills comparable to those learned in the stool class. Therefore, the instructor prefers that students have taken the "Make a Stool Using Hand Tools" class prior to this class, or they can demonstrate sufficient prior hand-tool use experience and gets pre-permission of the instructor.

Enrollment: Limited to three students, with a minimum of two.

Schedule: 4 sessions of 4 hours over a four-week period - prior to signing up for this class, verify dates and times using the on-line wood club monthly calendar, or contact the instructor.

Student Materials to Buy & Prepare Prior to Class: None - during the first class, the instructor will work with each student to find and purchase materials based on each student's preferences.

Description. The Octagonal Table class builds on the skills learned in "Make a Stool, Learn a Tool" by continuing the use of the spokeshave to shape legs, stretcher, and top. New skills presented in this course include bending the lower 1/3 of the leg into a flared foot, cutting half-lap joints into the stretchers and fitting stretchers into the legs.

Each student will take home a completed table.

Fee: \$40 for all 4 of the 4-hour sessions, but this does not include the materials. Each student will select their own wood-type, and pay based on the then-current prices as researched with the help of the instructor. Student will buy materials separately, or work with instructor to reimburse the Wood Club for actual material costs.

Tools: Tools used in this workshop include various spokeshaves, card scrapers, brace and bit, tri-square, bevel gauge, hand saw, dividers, taper tenon cutter, and taper mortise reamer. All tools are provided by the instructor allowing the participant to use tools before deciding to purchase.
