MUSINGS FROM THE TOOL CRIB JANUARY 2016:

I have been crib manager for a month now. The items listed below are just a reminder that our number one goal as crib monitors is to provide quality hand tools for our member's projects.

1. I have placed a legal sized note pad on the wall where the paging system controls were once located. Monitors can log any tools that are damaged and need repair, or missing. Please keep the tool crib door closed whenever possible.
2. Just a reminder: tools in boxes are marked with a shelf number; try and return them to the correct shelf.
3. Tools that are stored in a case should be inspected for missing parts when returned.
4. If a member requested a tool we don't have, write it on the legal pad and I will consider that tool for purchase.
5. There are no "stupid questions". Ask me and if I don't know the answer I will find someone who does.
